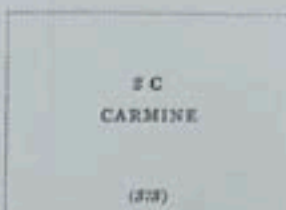

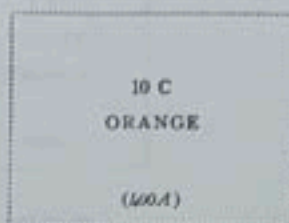

In the early 1920's, both flat plate and rotary press printing were used, with emphasis on the former. While various perforations or imperforations were employed, perforated 11 found favor as a compromise between stamp sheets too easy or too difficult to tear. New denominations were added to the value list, and new subjects, both personal and institutional.

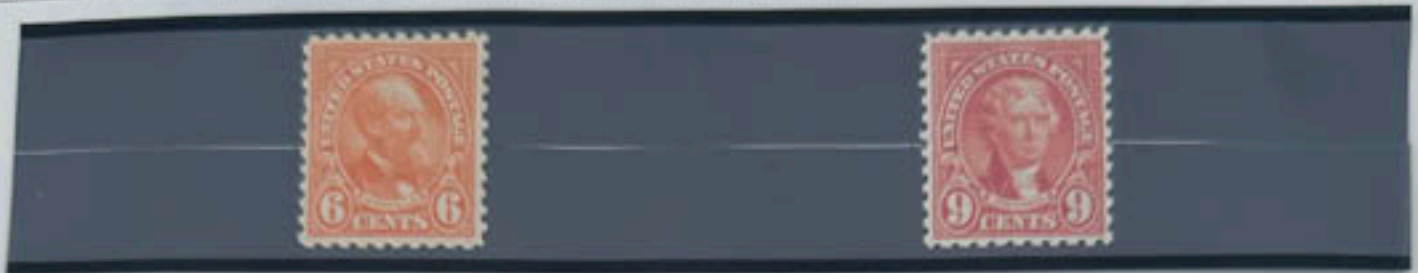

Gold Star Mothers Issue

Clara Barton Issue



Founded Am. Red Cross to join already-established Int'l. Red Cross (1881); first head of A. R. C., until 1904; 1882 influenced U. S. to sign Geneva Convention.



Honors "Gold Star Mothers" whose sons and daughters gave their lives in two World Wars.

Poultry Industry Centennial Issue



Called "chicken stamp" for obvious reasons, marks 100 years of organized poultry industry in the U. S. Light Brahma, shown, was first special breed imported.

Fort Kearny Issue



Named for Gen. Kearny of Mexican War fame. Set up on Platte River from 1848-1871. Protected Nebraska settlers and travelers on the Oregon Trail.

Volunteer Firemen Issue



Peter Stuyvesant, peg-legged leader of New Amsterdam (later N. Y. City), organized first volunteer fire brigade, 1648, to protect wood-and-thatch buildings.

Indian Centennial Issue



In tragic episode of Indian history, the "Five Civilized Tribes" were driven from their lands, on a "Trail of Tears" to strange Indian Territory, Okla. 1848.

Rough Riders Issue



50th anniversary of the 1st volunteer U. S. Cavalry, famed for the San Juan Hill (Cuba) foot-charge, Spanish-Amer. War (1898), led by Teddy Roosevelt, others.

Will Rogers Issue



Born and raised in Indian Territory, Okla., he was much beloved as humorist, philosopher, actor, writer.

Juliette Low Issue



Inspired by England's Boy Scouts and Girl Guides (having worked with them), Juliette Gordon Low (1860-1927) of Savannah, Ga. founded Girl Scouts of America in 1912.

Moina Michael Issue



YWCA executive who conceived idea of wearing artificial poppy as tribute to U. S. veterans and to raise funds for disabled vets. Plan adopted by American Legion, 1921.

Fort Bliss Centennial Issue



"Post of El Paso" became Ft. Bliss, 1948. Once the largest U. S. Cavalry post, today a major missile center.

Gettysburg Address Issue



On Nov. 19, 1863, President Lincoln dedicated the military cemetery at Gettysburg, Pa. with a speech that received little attention then, but has become a classic.

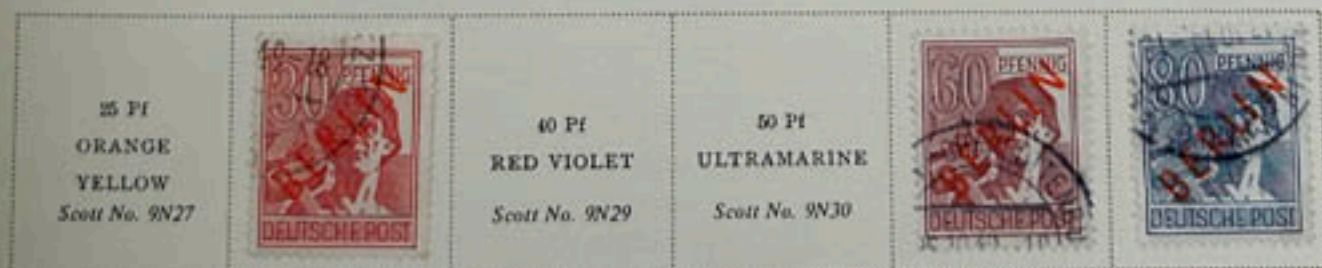

Fast Great Lakes steamers sped the bulk of goods between east and midwest.

The Pan-American Exposition opened on May 1, 1901, to cement feelings of solidarity and friendship between the American nations, from the Arctic to Cape Horn. Held in Buffalo, N. Y., it stressed Western Hemisphere progress in the 1800's. Some of the centers in the issue became reversed and are therefore prized as valuable rarities.

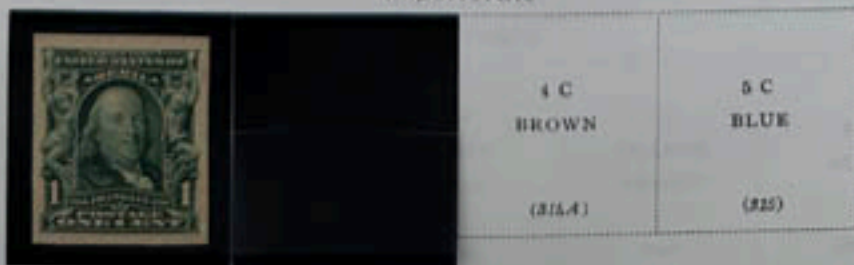
