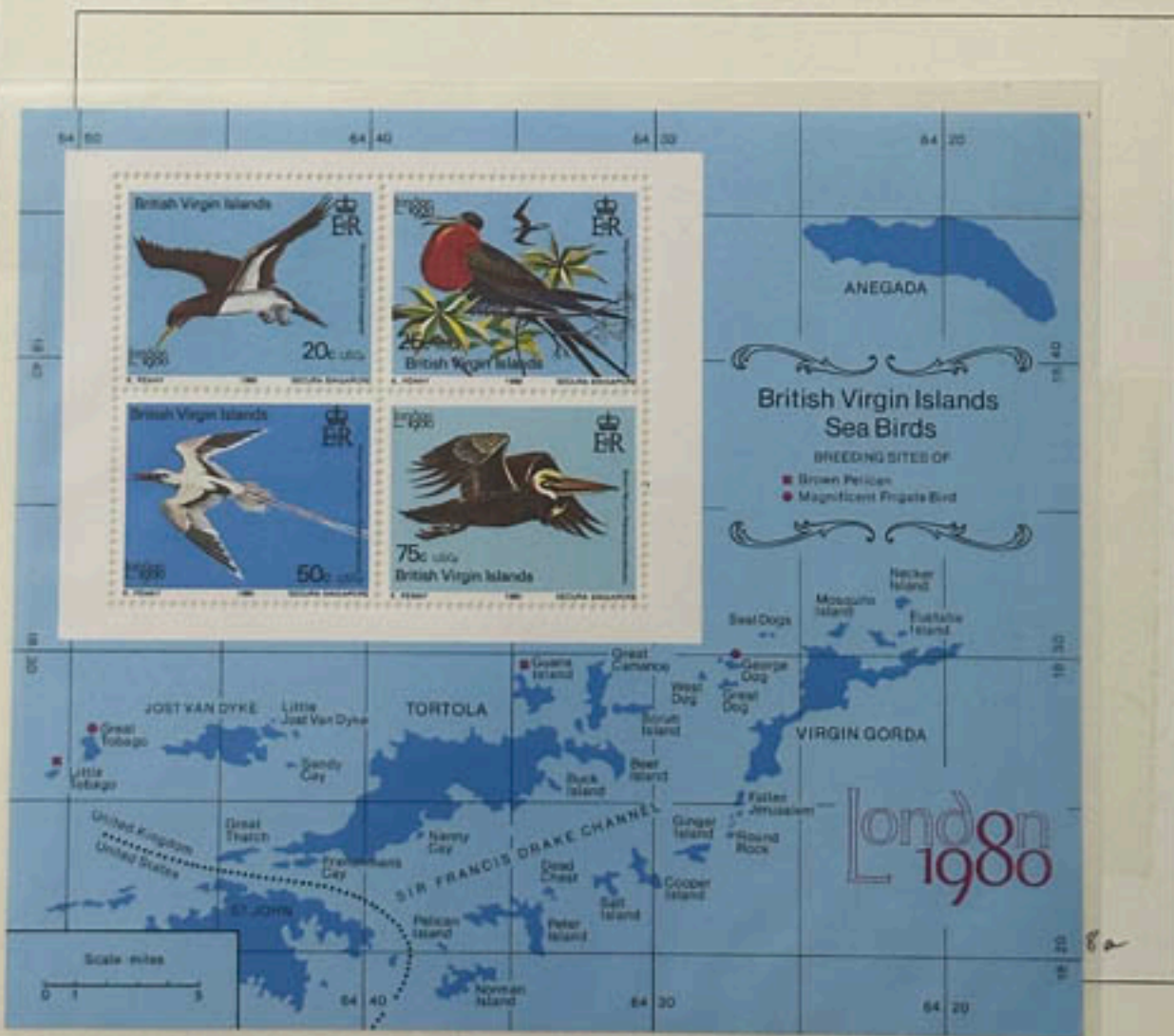
Third. The application of the ideal of service by every Rotarian to his personal, business, and community life;

Fourth. The advancement of international understanding, good will, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional men united in the ideal of service.



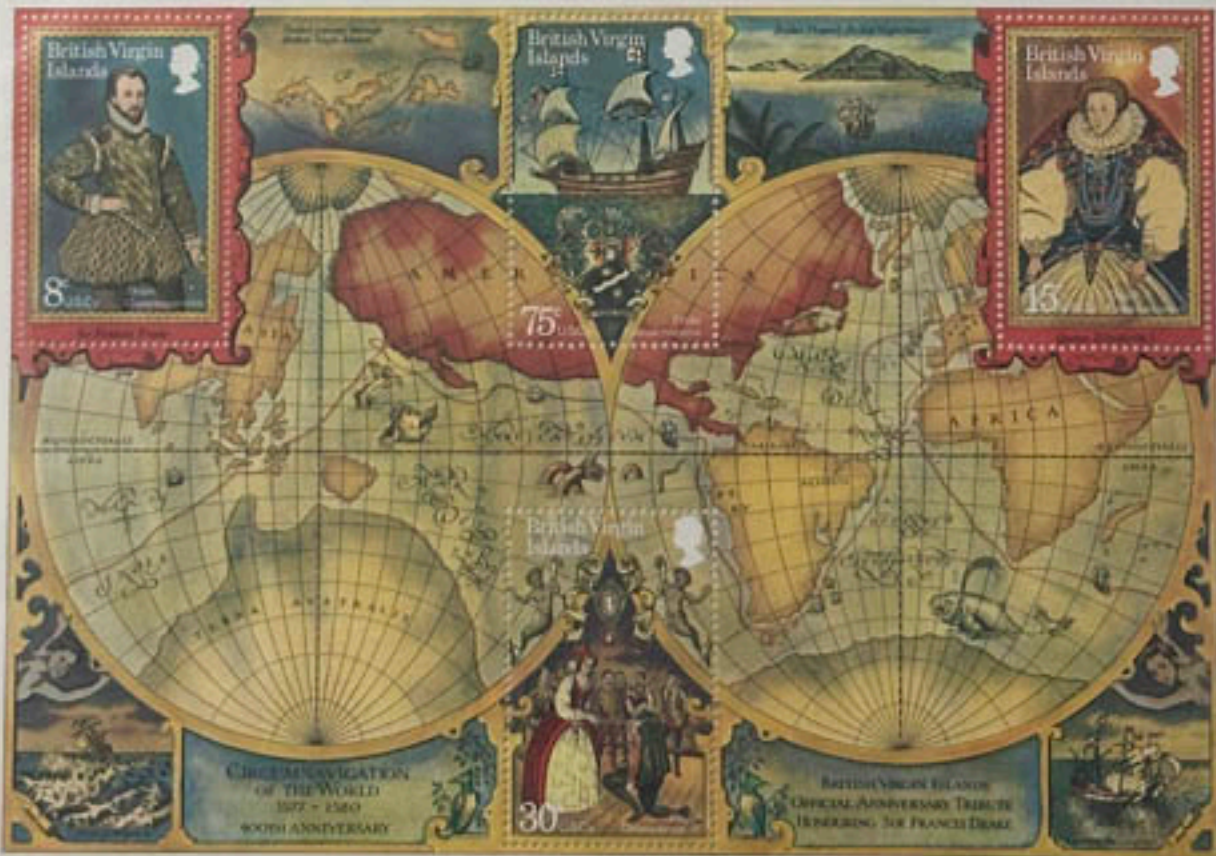

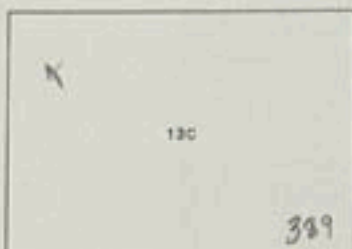

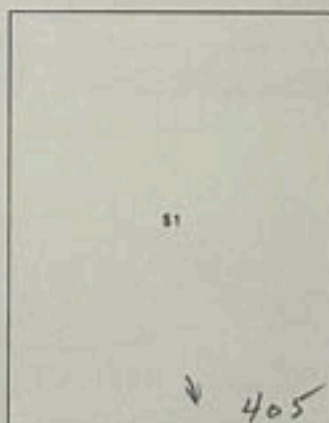

Boat Building
1983



Recorded registration of locally built boats dates back to the year 1855. The traditional way of building a boat on Tortola is to grade on keel length and side, to erect stem and stern posts with

proper overhang and with transoms stretched to stern post, then to erect the moulds on thirds of the keel. The length of the mast is 1.75 to 2.0 times that of the keel. After the boat is rig-

ged it is then planked in traditional fashion, garboard and sheer strakes first. Planks are planed to make them fit when bent around the frames. Edges are tapered to provide room for caulking.

BOAT BUILDING



BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS

Keels are made, at all points, from heavy, dense, tropical hardwood. Frames have been made traditionally in Tortola from white cedar, a medium sized deciduous tree. The

wood is hard and tough and often found with slight bends which can be utilized in frame construction to avoid the weak spots of joints. It is available on Tortola in sufficient quan-

ties for boat construction. Other materials used such as nails, oakum, tar, putty and paint are all obtained through commercial channels, largely from the United States of America.

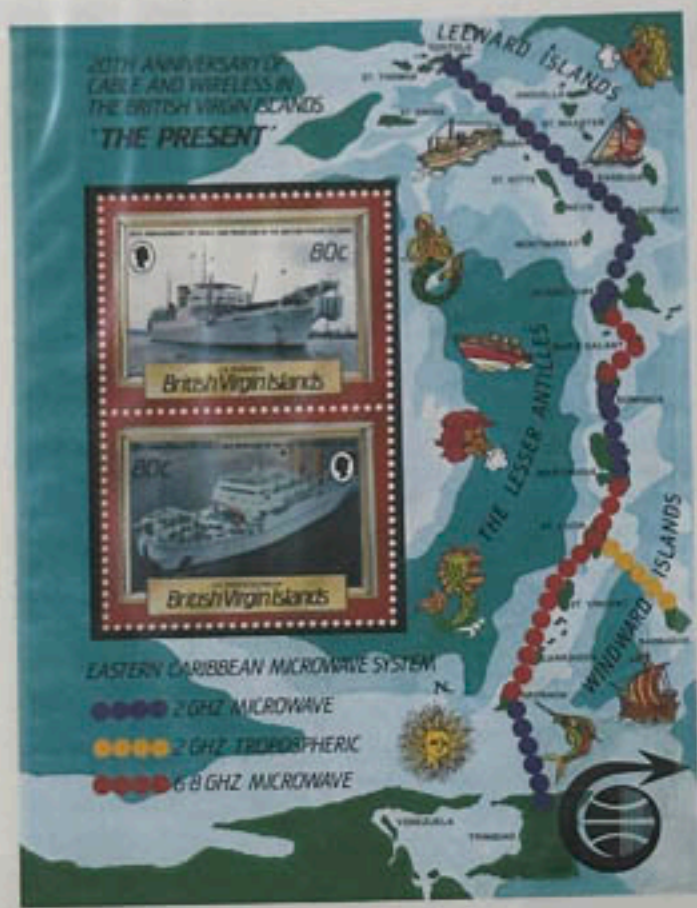

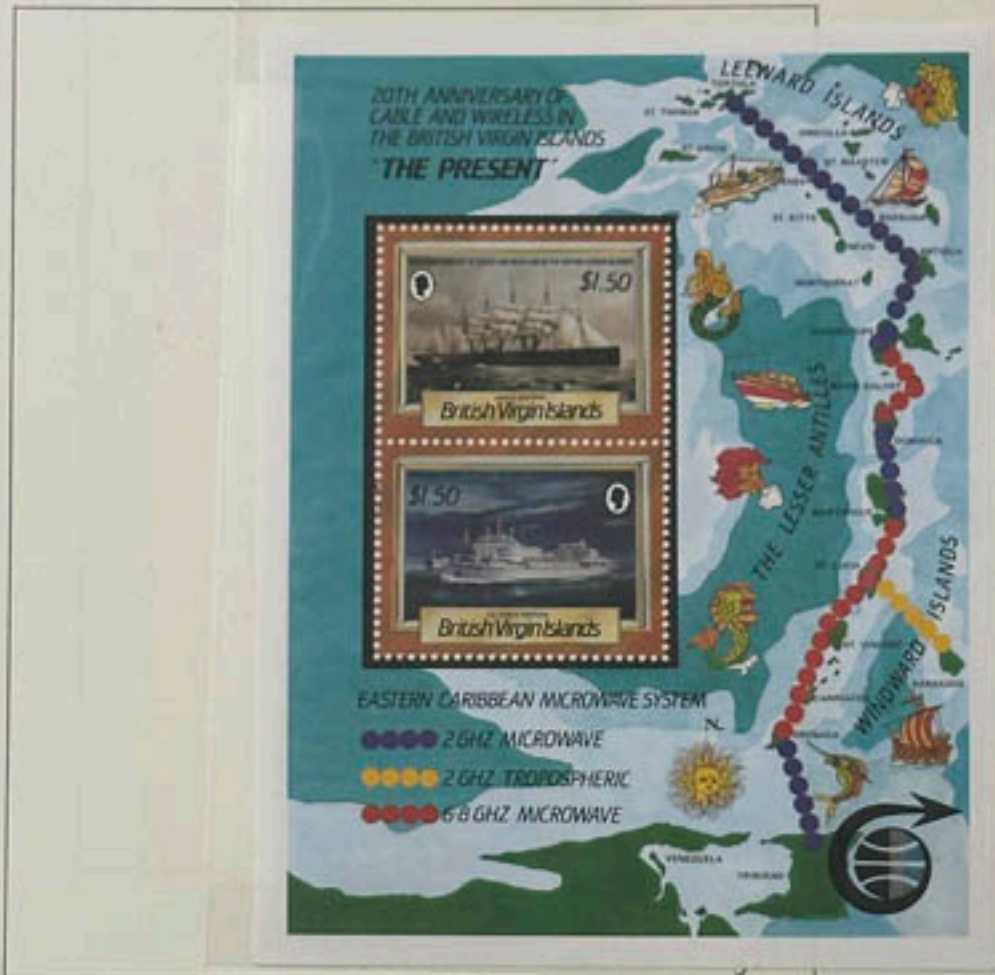
