RENDEZVOUS IN SPACE

On the 22nd of December 1965, Wednesday afternoon, the U.S. Gemini 6 and Gemini 7 space ships orbited nose to nose, a few feet apart. Guided by giant computers and the precise hand of command pilot Walter M. Schirra and co-pilot Thomas Stafford, Gemini 6 had overtaken the marathon crew of Frank Borman and James Lovell aboard Gemini 7; traveling a 25,000-mile course at a speed of 5 miles a second, they had managed to come within 6 feet of each other. For six hours, like a pair of dolphins swimming in the vast dark sea of space, the two ships whirled around the earth.
